# **CAPTAINS CHECK-IN AND ROSTER CHANGES**

Team Captains will be able to check-in for the National Championship beginning Wednesday, July 23, 2003 at 6:00 pm at the Championship registration desk. All captains MUST check-in prior to Thursday's team event to confirm your team's participation. Teams that fail to check-in may be removed from the championship. Captain, if you're unable to make the check-in, have another teammate check-in for the team.

**IMPORTANT: ALL ROSTER CHANGES MUST BE SUBMITTED IN WRITING NO LATER THAN 9:00 PM CST WEDNESDAY, July 23, 2003. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE TO THIS DEADLINE.**

Roster change forms will be available at the registration desk. They should be completed and returned to the registration desk prior to the 9:00 PM deadline.

As the ADA office will be closed from July 18-28, 2003, team roster changes can be submitted in writing via fax to the Ramada Plaza Sales Office, fax (847) 827-5220. Please include your name, team name, detailed roster changes, and contact information including day/night phone numbers. Please note that the Ramada Plaza Sales Office closes at 5:00 PM CST each day.

No faxed roster changes will be accepted after the Sales Office closes on Wed., July 23, 2003.

## **CAPTAINS MEETING**

The Captains Meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 23, 2003 at 9:00 pm (location to be announced). Important information regarding rules and regulations of the Championship will be outlined. If you cannot make this meeting, please appoint a representative from your team to attend.

## **MEMBERSHIP CARDS**

All members MUST have their membership cards. Existing members can request a replacement membership card at the Registration desk. Please note there is a \$5.00 service fee for replacement cards.

New members (walk-ins) and renewal members can complete a membership application and submit it along with the membership fee at the Registration Center. A 2003 membership card will then be issued.

This bar-coded ADA membership card is required to register for all events and collect prize money. Don't lose your card!

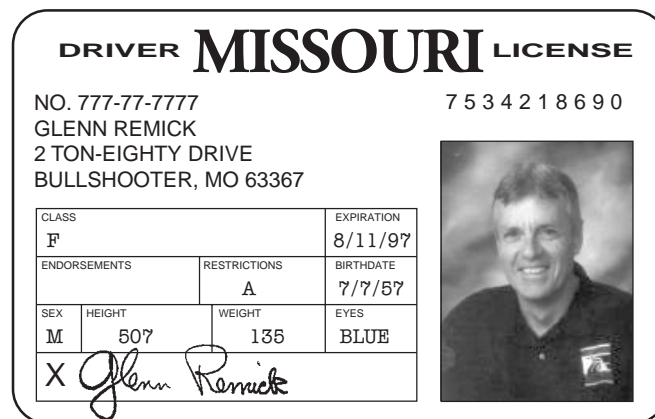

# EVENT REGISTRATION

Team event and Singles events are by pre-registration only. Only members that pre-registered for the Singles events when their teams registered are eligible to compete.

Teams: Captains should check in at the Championship registration desk prior to the Opening Ceremonies on Thursday, July 24th.

Registration for Men's & Women's Doubles and Mixed Triples should be done at the Championship Registration Center. Check the Registration hours for exact times. Only members that have competed on teams in the National Championship are eligible for the Doubles and Mixed Triples event. Membership cards are required to register for these events. The order that the members register for in Neutralizer Doubles event determines their playing order (Player #1 & Player #2).

Friday and Saturday night, Open Draw Doubles events are open to ALL ADA members. Register at the Championship Registration Center. Team members can only compete in the draw doubles event that corresponds with their team dart type.

# EVENT COMPETITION

The ADA Championship software is designed to make the National Championship more effective and efficient. This system eliminates the time consuming element of writing during registration. ADA personnel simply "swipe" your ADA membership card to enter you into events. When registration closes your entry is transferred electronically to the Control Center. The software randomly places members onto the competition bracket. A dartboard is assigned and your match card is printed.

The event bracket is displayed via a projector indicating the match and board assignment. In the team events, match cards will be available along a table by the bracket for each round. There will be NO initial match calls in the team event. Captains simply find their board assignments from the display, pick up the match sheet and proceed to their match. Should the opposing team not arrive within 5 minutes, take the match card to the Control Center and the Championship Director will make a 2nd call. This process will repeat after 5 min. for a 3rd call. Five minutes following the 3rd call the Championship Director may call a forfeit. Check the team event schedule for start times for additional rounds.

In the remaining events, the bracket will be displayed and match cards will be available nearby. There will be NO match calls in the first rounds of these events. Members should locate their board assignments from the display, pick up their match sheets and proceed to their match immediately. Should your opponent not arrive within 5 minutes, take the match card to the Control Center where the Championship Director will make a 2nd call. This process will repeat after 5 min. for a 3rd call. Five minutes following the 3rd call, the Championship Director may call a forfeit. Throughout the additional rounds of the event, the bracket display will update with board assignments and opponents.

Each match card contains bar codes, the board assignment, bracket position and payout indications. Upon completion of the match, simply circle the winner's name and return it to the Control Center. DO NOT interfere with the bar code. ADA staff will "swipe" the winner's bar code and the software advances the winners to the next round of the bracket. Once a match is ready another card is generated.

To keep events "running smoothly" please return match cards immediately following the completion of the match.

For Neutralizer events and selected Open events, there will also be a scorecard with the match card. \_01 starting scores, points remaining and total darts MUST be recorded on the score card and returned with the match card to the Control Center at the conclusion of the match.

We appreciate your cooperation in making this event a fun, enjoyable time for all members.

# STARTING RULES FOR ALL EVENTS

To determine who throws first for the bulls-eye in ALL events, toss a coin. The winner of the toss is the home team (or singles player #1) and throws first for the bulls-eye in the odd numbered games. The loser of the toss throws first for the bulls-eye in the even number games. In each game, the closest dart to the bull's-eye starts the game.

Soft tip darts: Count holes to determine who is closest to the center. In the event of a tie, re-throw with darts remaining in the board. A dart is pulled only when it hits the very center hole.

Steel tip darts: A double bull's-eye defeats a single bull's-eye. The member throwing second can request a dart to be removed from the bull's-eye (single or double). In the event of a tie, remove the darts and re-throw until the tie is broken.

\* Matches in this round may begin sooner provided both teams have completed their preliminary rounds.

The Team Event format is similar to your weekly League match. In the Team League format the first team to win 7 games (no bonus point) is declared the winner; for the Express League format the first team to win 9 games (no bonus point) is the winner. Home Team will list their members on the score sheet in the order they will compete. The score sheet will be folded in half, such that the Away Team cannot see the Home Team lineup. The Away Team will complete their lineup. Both Captains are responsible for entering the correct data onto the score sheet.

**Every member listed on the roster approved by the ADA National Headquarters MUST play in the first round of play. No team will be allowed to play with less than four members. participation in the team event is a requirement for the non-team events.**

*Neutralizer*® matches:

- \_01 singles will be 301 open in / open out
- Singles 301 games will play with the double bull "deactivated" (entire bull worth 50 points)
- Use the *Neutralizer*® for ALL games

Open matches:

- \_01 singles will be 501 open in / double out
- Singles 501 games will play with the double bull "activated" (split bull - single worth 25 points & double worth 50 points)
- All games will be played "scratch" (no *Neutralizer*®)

Upon completion of the match, both captains must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center.

### **NEUTRALIZER® DOUBLES EVENT (MEN'S & WOMEN'S):**

Designate a Captain. Both Captains are responsible for entering the correct data onto the score sheet. Event games are 301 Singles and Cricket Doubles. The first team to win 3 games is declared the winner. Upon completion of the match, both team captains must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center. Either member may throw first in cricket games, no set order.

### **NEUTRALIZER® SINGLES EVENT (MEN'S & WOMEN'S):**

Event game is 301 open in / open out. The first member to win 3 games is declared the winner. Upon completion of the match, both players must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center.

### **NEUTRALIZER® MIXED TRIPLES EVENT:**

Designate a Captain. Event game is Cricket, best of 5, the first team to win 3 games is declared the winner. Upon completion of the match, both captains must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center. Any member may throw first in cricket games, no set order.

### **OPEN SINGLES EVENT (MEN'S & WOMEN'S):**

Event game is 501 open in / double out. The first member to win 3 games is declared the winner. Upon completion of the match, both players must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center.

### **OPEN DOUBLES EVENT (MEN'S & WOMEN'S):**

Designate a Captain. Both Captains are responsible for entering the correct data onto the score sheet. Event game is Cricket Doubles, best of 5, the first team to win 3 games is declared the winner. Upon completion of the match, both captains must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center. Either member may throw first in cricket games, no set order.

### **OPEN DRAW DOUBLES EVENT:**

Designate a Captain. Both Captains are responsible for entering the correct data onto the score sheet. Event game is Double Elimination Cricket Doubles, best of 3, the first team to win 2 games is declared the winner in the "Winners Bracket". "Losers Bracket" is one game of Cricket with the winner advancing. Upon completion of the match, both captains must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center. Either member may throw first in cricket games, no set order.

### **OPEN MIXED TRIPLES EVENT:**

Designate a Captain. Event game is Cricket, best of 5, the first team to win 3 games is declared the winner. Upon completion of the match, both captains must sign the score sheet and the winner must return it immediately to the Control Center. Any member may throw first in cricket games, no set order.

# NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GENERAL RULES AND PROCEDURES

1. Only ADA League Team members are eligible to compete in the National Championship Team, Singles, Doubles, and Triples events. Non-team league members are eligible for the Open Mixed Doubles, Draw Doubles and Satellite events only.
2. All ADA members/teams shall play by these Championship Rules and, where necessary, any supplemental rules established by ADA personnel.
3. Any member/team who, during the course of any event, fails to comply with any of these Championship Rules, may be subject to disqualification from any event.
4. Good sportsmanship shall be the prevailing attitude throughout the championship.
5. Decisions regarding the prize structure, event schedule, method of member registration, and the choice of match pairing shall be the responsibility and discretion of the ADA.
6. Protests - All matches must be completed in a sportsmanlike manner regardless of the alleged violation. To file a protest request an "Official Protest Form" at the Control Center. Complete the form and submit with a \$100.00 filing fee that is refundable if the protest is granted. You will be contacted before the championship ends if further action will be taken. Your protest will follow the member/team throughout the championship. A three member "Protest Committee" will review your protest.
7. Once a member/team is assigned a match, competition must begin within 15 minutes. Should a member/team fail to report to the assigned board within the 15 minute allotted time, a forfeit will be called. Match pairings will be called 3 times only (5 minutes between calls). Each member is allowed a nine-dart warm-up.
8. Only members involved in the match and scorekeepers are allowed inside the playing area.
9. The minimum throwing distance shall be 7' 6" from the surface of the dartboard to the front of the throw line, with a marker placed parallel to the board at least 24" in length. The maximum throwing distance is 8'.
10. There will be a time limit for each round of the team events. If a match is still in play at the end of the time period (2-1/2 hours for Team League & 3 hours for Express League), the team with the most points will be declared the winner. In the event the score of game wins is tied, the team with the lowest points remaining total from \_01 games will be declared the winner.
11. It is permissible for a doubles or triples team to participate while missing a player, provided the team forfeits that turn in the rotation. The missing member may join a game in progress provided he/she joins in the proper sequence.
12. Coaching by team members and spectators is allowed but be considerate to other members in matches being played on boards/machines nearby.
13. All prize money MUST be collected from registration/payout desk prior to the conclusion of the National Championship. Uncollected prize money will be forfeited and will not be forwarded to any members.

Please make certain to watch your match sheets for your place in the event bracket/payout and stop by the registration/payout desk frequently to check for unclaimed prize money.

# Selected Championship event finals will be on the finals stage.

## EQUIPMENT

**Electronic Soft Tip:** All competition shall take place on Valley Cougar 8 dart machines. The maximum weight for Electronic soft tip darts is 24 grams (barrel, shaft & flight).

**English Steel-Tip:** All competition shall be on Dart World bristle dartboards. The maximum weight for English steel tip darts is 50 grams (barrel only).

## SCORING

A dart shall be counted as part of the turn if it hits the dartboard, backboard or dart machine.

### SOFT-TIP DARTS:

The score recorded by the machine is the score the member receives. The member accepts that "THE MACHINE IS ALWAYS CORRECT". A dart that sticks in the target but does not activate the electronic scoring MAY NOT be manually scored. If a dart bounces off the board, it is considered a dart thrown even if it does not score. It may not be thrown again. If a dart is thrown before the "THROW DART" message lights, the dart is considered a dart thrown and may not be thrown again.

If a member throws while the machine is at an opposing member's turn:

- a. If the member has thrown less than three darts, the machine is advanced to the correct position by use of the "Player Change" button and the member is allowed to throw the remaining darts. The game then proceeds normally with the opponent(s) next turn.
- b. If a member throws all three darts on his opponent's number before the information is noticed, that member has completed the turn and the machine is advanced to the proper position (opponent's turn), and the game proceeds normally. Should the member end the game on that turn, the opposing member/team wins.
- c. In Singles play, if a member manually scores on the opponent's turn, the opponent throws the remaining darts to complete the full turn, with the penalized member losing their next turn.
- d. In Doubles and Triples play, if the member throws out of turn the machine is advanced to the opponent's position, play resumes and the team causing the infraction loses their next 2 turns.
- e. In All events, if a member manually scores points, those points shall stand and the member / team loses their next turn. Should the member reach zero, the opponent wins.

## **ENGLISH STEEL TIP DARTS:**

- a. For a dart to score, it must remain in the dartboard a minimum of five (5) seconds after the third or final dart is thrown.
- b. A dart's score shall be determined from the side of the wire in which the point of the dart entered the dartboard. Should a dart lodge directly between the connecting wires of the dartboard, making it impossible to determine on which side of the wire the dart resides, the score shall always be the higher value of the two segments in question.
- c. Verification of the score is the responsibility of the score keeper and the score shall stand once the darts are pulled from the dartboard. No darts shall be touched prior to the decision of the score keeper.
- d. The score keeper may inform the member on how many points have been scored or how many points remain, but only when asked.
- e. While the score keeper shall be the sole authority in charge of the game, his calling of the scores may be challenged by either member or their respective Team Captain.
- f. In All events, a member throwing out of turn shall receive zero score for that turn and his team shall forfeit that turn.

## **PRIZES AND AWARDS (SOFT-TIP AND STEEL TIP)**

In addition to the prize monies listed in this directory, the ADA will award plaques to the top four in each event. A medallion for "Most Valuable Player" will be awarded to the male and female members (Soft-tip and Steel-tip) with the best performance based on win/loss percentage and individual achievements (Nine mark, 180's, Hat Tricks).

### **SEEDING OF TOP POINTS PER DART AVERAGE MEMBERS (SOFT-TIP AND STEEL-TIP)**

The American Darters Association National Championship remains the world's only championship that "seeds" the top English Steel-Tip and Electronic Soft-Tip members in the Singles event. The top 16 men and 8 women members with the highest PPDA's based upon their skills from league play will be placed into the top 32 and 16 brackets.

# CHAMPIONSHIP DRESS CODE

The dress code for the championship will be appropriately casual. The Championship Officials will determine any dress code violations. **Any person** deemed to be in violation of the dress code ***will be asked to leave*** the championship room and return in the proper attire. Individual matches will not be delayed due to dress code violations.

- a. Men's proper dress will include dress slacks, designer blue jeans, dress shorts, polo's, collared or team shirts, with casual leather or canvas shoes.
- b. Women's proper dress will include dress slacks, skirts or dress shorts (mid-thigh or longer), designer blue jeans, designer warm-ups, polo's, dress blouses or sweaters, non-collared shirts in good taste or team shirts, casual leather or canvas shoes.

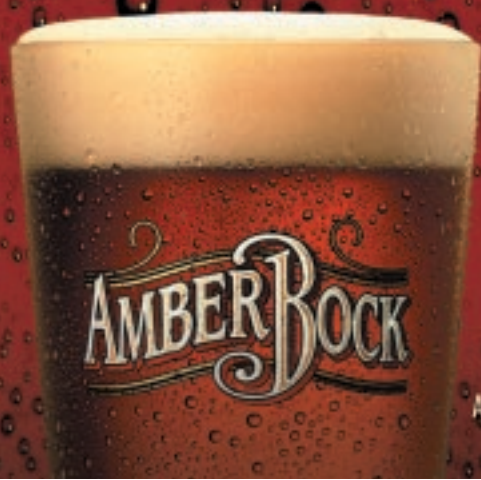
